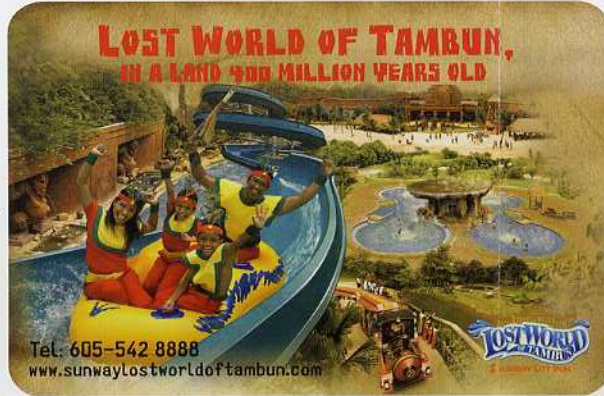




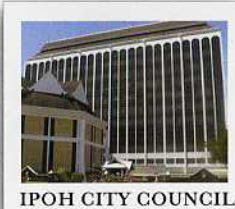
IPOH'S PREFERRED DESTINATION

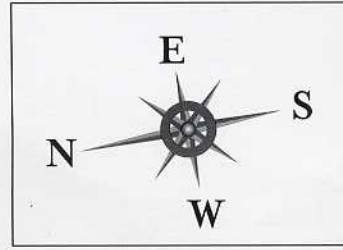
IPOH'S LATEST DEVELOPMENT

How to script a trip

The Ipoh Old Town should be first in every visitor's list when combing Ipoh. Flanking Kinta river at the western side, this is where it all began. Feast your eyes with monuments, buildings and shop houses that mark Ipoh's timeline. Between street hopping, find a cosy coffee shop and take a break with an aromatic cup of Ipoh White Coffee. The old town shuts down typically by 5pm, when businesses wind down and proprietors head home. After sun down, it's a good time to explore the other side of Ipoh. Stroll pass various Art Deco styled buildings, especially old theatres, and end the hike in time for dinner. What's good? Think no more, head straight to *Jalan Sultan Idris*, or Ipoh's *Wai Sek Kai* (glutton's street), a famous al fresco dining street near Syuen Hotel. Also thrill your taste buds at Theatre Street or *Lao Wong Kai* for a hearty meal of bean sprout, chicken and noodles. Begin the next day with great bite-size dumplings in Ipoh's Dim Sum pocket at *Jalan Leong Sin Nam* and *Jalan Raja Ekram*. This is where locals while away the morning hours and catch up with some local news. Among the dim sum fraternity, Foh San Restaurant lead the pack. To shave of some calorie after the breakfast, veer over to Little India and spend some hours gazing at colourful sarres and copper wares. Consider the Lost World of Tambun before escaping Ipoh.

The Ipoh Malay aristocrat community made *Jalan Datoh* and *Jalan Bendahara*, some of the earliest roads in Ipoh, their base within the vicinity of Kinta river. Baroque mansions were put up in *Kampung Jawa* and *Kampung Kuchai* during the reign of Orang Kaya-Kaya Seri Adika Raja Wan Muhammad Saleh in early 20th century. Nonetheless, by 1930s, many Malay aristocrats have moved out and these splendid dwellings were taken over by Chinese towkays, notably Dato' Seri Lau Pak Khuan. Today, the age of bygone Malay villages is depicted by old rain trees that pepper their grounds. Nothing much is left except some auto-repair workshops operating in deteriorating old building. Modernity has taken its toll.
