• According to one of our sources from Australia, John had a brother named Benjamin who also went to Australia and lived in Ballarat. 3 of Benjamin's sons were miners who she believes may have worked with John.

- Our source also mentioned of George Addis, believed to be one of John's son's, who worked with him in the mines and died in Ipoh as well, presumably before John died.
   We found one George Addis, born 1878 to John Addis and his third wife, Elizabeth (Palmer) Addis.
- We also found another John Addis who lived in Daylesford and died at the age of 73 in 1880, he could have been an uncle of John's. <u>A report on his death.</u>
- We also found something on a John Addis, of Daylesford, a miner who was made an executor of Martha Chapman's will in 1866. We are unsure if this is Captain John Addis or the possible relation with the same name. <u>Link</u>
